WARRANT ARTICLES

The average cost-per-pupil for the preceding year as calculated in accordance with RSA 189:75, I(a) is \$35,063.
ELA Proficiency: 52%
Math Proficiency: 29%
Science Proficiency: 31%

ARTICLE 2. (As amended) Shall the School District raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling **\$7,370,153** (of which \$400,000 is for estimated grant expenditures that have an offsetting revenue of \$400,000 resulting in a \$0 tax impact)? (The School Board recommends this appropriation 4-1-0). (The Advisory Budget Committee recommends this appropriation 4-1-0).

Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be **\$7,114,497** (of which \$400,000 is for estimated grant expenditures that have an offsetting revenue of \$400,000 resulting in a \$0 tax impact) which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the School District or by law or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only.

ARTICLE 3. Shall the voters of the Madison School District adopt a school administrative unit budget of **\$1,527,007** for the 2026-2027 school year in which **\$527,065** is assigned to the school budget of this district? (The School Board recommends this appropriation 5-0-0). (The Advisory Budget Committee does NOT recommend this appropriation 5-0-0).

This year's adjusted budget of **\$1,438,672** with **\$495,120** assigned to the School District budget will be adopted if the article does not receive a majority vote of all the district voters voting in this administrative unit.

ARTICLE 4. Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of up to **\$15,000** to be added to the previously established Special Education Capital Reserve Fund? This sum to come from June 30 unassigned fund balance available for transfer on July 1, no amount to be raised from additional taxation. (The current Special Education CRF balance excluding interest earned from 6/30/25 is \$235,270.50.) (The School Board recommends this appropriation 4-1-0). (The Advisory Budget Committee recommends this appropriation 5-0-0).

ARTICLE 5. Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$80,000** to be placed in the previously established Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund? (The current Building Maintenance CRF balance including obligations and excluding interest earned from 6/30/2025 is \$145,558.46). (The School Board recommends this appropriation 5-0-0). (The Advisory Budget Committee recommends this appropriation 5-0-0).

ARTICLE 6. Shall the School District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of **\$25,000** to be placed in the previously established Madison Corner Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund? (The current Madison Corner Schoolhouse CRF balance excluding interest earned from 6/30/25 is \$50,394.37.) (The School Board recommends this appropriation 4-1-0). (The Advisory Budget Committee recommends this appropriation 4-1-0).
